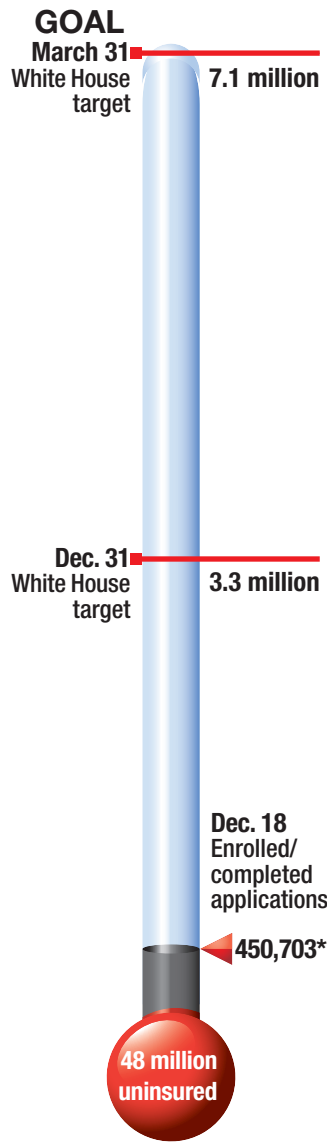


Enrollment Obameter
